You or any other members of the group may be interested in some of the following scratchpad locations :-

64312 (&FB38) contains current TCOL. Useful if you forget what TCOL is being used! For example after PEEKing you may get the value &F1. The F, which is equal to 15, is the text colour, while the 1, the background colour.

64313 (&fb39) contains current GCOL. The same rules as above apply, first digit (in hex) foreground colour, second the graphic background colour.

64319 (&FB3F) contains ASCII value of the cursor character. POKE 64319,161 will give a cursor character of the underline shape.

64320 (&FB40) is the ASCII code for the chevron (>>) prompt when in MOS.

64321 (&FB41) contains value of 32, which is blink rate of the cursor. PEEKing a lower value will give a higher blink rate.

64322 (&FB42) holds value 160 which is initial delay before a key repeats. A lower value will shorten the delay.

64323 (&FB43) controls repeat rate of a key held down. Normally 16, a lower value will increase the rate.

64326 (&FB46) contains the ASCII value of the last key pressed or held down, and as well as being fast has the advantage over KBD in as much that KBD only returns the value of the last key pressed, if the key is held down KBD returns the value once and thereafter 0 until another key is held down.

64335 (&FB4F) contains the current screen size 32 or 40. Thus it is possible to alter this byte without clearing the screen, and have both types of display on the same line. There are some adverse side effects, especially when editing, but if used with care can be of good use.

664406/7 (&FB96/7) this stores the current X co-ordinate of the graphics pointer in 2 bytes. This is of course in relation to the origin not the screen. You could move the X co-ordinate by using DOKE 64406, new X position.

664408/9 (&FB98/9) contains the current Y co-ordinate of the graphics pointer, and is similar to as above

64410/1 (&FB9A/B) contains the X origin co-ordinate. These 2 bytes are updated when the ORIGIN command is used.

64412/3 (&FB9C/D) contains the Y origin co-ordinate.

All due thanks to the book 'Relatively Basic' for these.



---

Well does anybody know what happened to EASIDATA II which was supposed to be an 80 column business version. John Cantrill would like to know if it was ever distributed by Peter Noblett of Dean Software -- by the way Dean Software seem to have pulled right out of the Einey market. Any news direct to John please.

#### MERLIN SOFTWARE CATALOGUE

---

A new name but an old familiar friend. MERLIN Software is the name used by Blagbrough & Hebblethwaite of Halifax to market their software range. Interesting but not earth shattering news. BUT, BUT, BUT the good news is that Brian Thomas of B&H has produced a rather super and very comprehensive catalogue listing ALL KNOWN Einstein software and hardware. The catalogue runs to 78 A4 pages and lists books, hardware and software (categorised into educational, business, utilities, verticals etc etc.). A great reference manual. Brian will send you one for just 75 pence. I told him to charge a quid but the man insists on 75 pence (that includes the catalogue AND the postage). A real bargain. I think we should say 'ta' to B&H for producing it. By the way although Brian has listed the recommended price of all the items he says you should always 'give him a bell' because he can often do you a better deal.

## PROGRAMMABLE 40/80 COLUMN SWITCH

---

That old faithful work horse Alex Calderhead of Glasgow has been busy again. He's only just recovered from the effort of typing in a massive database listing he found in Personal Computer World (see freedisc 918) and now he has produced a bit of gadgetry to help switch from 40 to 80 columns under software control. The switch can be set up from BASIC or any other language which can access the user port and the commands are very simple. He would like to sell them at a modest price to recover his time and the components inside (there are a couple of chips, wires, leads, sockets etc all contained in a neat box). The blurb below reveals all, if you're interested contact Alex direct please.

To connect it to the Einstein, switch off first, then connect the ribbon cable to the User Port, with the small polarizing slots on the plug uppermost.

Using the existing six-pin Din cable, connect the grey cable on the switch to the Computer. Connect the 80 COL card to the Phono socket next to the gray cable. Having done that, you can either connect it to the colour monitor OR a monochrome monitor, NOT BOTH. The black DIN cable goes to the TMO1 monitor, and the mono monitor connects to the other Phono socket.

Switch on the computer, the switch defaults to 40 COL on power-up, so the familiar Einstein logo should appear, if not check the connections. No harm will be done to the computer or interface as a result of wrong connections..

On side A of the disc there are two COM files.:

40COL.COM and 80COL.COM.

From DOS type 80COL, the screen should change to the 80 COL format, typing 40COL should get you back into 40 COL mode.

I have the 80COL file on all my 80 COL software, and set the disc to autoboot the file on power-up. I have set side B of the disc to do just this.

The switch can be set from within BASIC or any other language that can access the user port.

The file on side B of the disc called 14-3/80.XBS demonstrates this. \*

Load XBAS+ and run the program, it starts off in 80 COL mode, you will be asked if you want to see the diagram, press Y, the screen

PRESS  
CTRL P.

then changes to the 40 COL mode and displays the diagram, on pressing any key it switches back to 80 COL, and the program continues in the text mode.

The commands to do this are simple:

At the start of the program place in a line the command:  
OUT &33,15:REM THIS SETS THE PIO TO OUTPUT

The command to switch to 80 COL is:

OUT &32,1:PRINT CHR\$(16):REM SET OUTPUT TO 80 COL

OUT &32,0:PRINT CHR\$(14):REM SET OUTPUT TO 40 COL

---

I have to be honest, for me Einstein is a tool and I regret I don't have the

time to take him to bits or get heavily into software writing. In fact some computer buffs can become computer bores (present company excepted of course). But I NEVER become bored by the myriad uses to which our members put their machines. How about the new member (I shall spare his blushes in case he is embarrassed by the way I mention this)... who is using a statistical package and an Einey to record and investigate the patterns of the veins upon bees-wings? Now there is a man I'd love to meet. I've already mentioned Robert interested in stocks and share, John Cantrill into genealogy and if YOU have an unusual use for your Einey it would be interesting to hear details.

#### A BBCBASIC Program

---

The following is from Michael Chew (EUDB 3259) and whilst I have been persuaded on this occasion to publish the listing I think if you're interested in it you should contact Michael and do a swop for a ready keyed in version.

I enclose a listing of a menu/boot program that I use as a user interface to my application programs written in BBC basic. It sets up the function keys, displays the time and a boot menu.

The time program is 'cribed' from the BBC basic program disc without some of the error traps (you can display some very strange times if you wish)-I assume some intelligence on the part of the operator.

The menu part 'PROC\_load' prints the boot menu (in 80-column format) and at line 450 waits 98 'ticks' for a key to be pressed and if no key is pressed it reads the clock and starts again. On line 510 it calls itself to trap any key presses which do not call for a specific response.

'PROC\_TIME' on line 650 reads the inbuilt time function and can be used in any program to display the time from the last reset or switch-on. To save the chore of resetting the time I put a version of the program without 'PROC\_setime' (and its call on line 20) on the same disc and 'CHAIN' it on exit from an application. All applications contain similar menus (or is it meni) with appropriate 'TAB' settings to display the time.

I set the disc to auto-boot and reduce the command line to the minimum by renaming 'BBCBASIC.COM' to 'B.COM' and saving the bootfile as 'A.BBC' so the command line is just fed the three hex values 42 20 41.

I hope this may be of use to a fellow user of BBC basic which I think should have been TATUNG's standard language for the EINSTEIN because of its better precision and features.

## WORDSTAR

---

Just a quick word to all you lot who use naughty copies of Wordstar. You cannot INSTALL Wordstar under DOS version 1.11, so you're wasting your time. Try it under DOS 1.31 and I'm told that it works.

## EUDB MEMBERS LISTINGS

---

One member thinks that the 32 page listing is great but it is difficult to keep it together and he thinks it ought to be stapled or bound. Well, I suggest you punch holes in it yourself and put it into a ring binder. But if you'd like a BOUND copy ( just like your computer manuals), it can be done but at a cost. BOUND copies, wire binding inside a card cover are available if you really cannot live without them. The cost however is £1.00 to cover the binding costs and the post and packing.

## SUPER NEWS FROM XTAL RESEARCH

---

Xtal Basic 4 is the bog-standard basic issued with Einsteins. Some members will also be using Xtal System Five which gives an enhanced basic plus a faster operating system (DOS Version 2. ) and some other goodies. The cost of System Five was about £69 and it is available only direct from Crystal Research at Torquay. Trevor Brownen now tells me that they have introduced a COMPILER. You know what a compiler is, it turns a basic program into a com program so that it can be run direct from the operating system without loading Basic, also it runs faster and also it cannot be listed and tampered with. The price of the Xtal Basic Compiler is FIVE POUNDS (yes, that is correct £5). You must send your original System Five disc back to Crystal to get it. (Please note that the original System Five disc is NOT the same as the original Master System Disc which everybody gets with their machine). Trevor says that henceforth the compiler will also be included on all new copies of the System Five. Now that is what I call back-up service.

## Second EPROM Slot

---

the second eprom slot inside Einey is required to run Mike Baylis' super high capacity disc drive and also the silicon ram disc which we mentioned last time. C.B. Denman (EUDB 3070) is just one of several members who have mentioned whether it might be used for carrying customised chips, containing for example all your regular programs. Any ideas anybody - give C.B. himself a ring - or float some ideas via the newsletter.

## MASS STORAGE ONTO VIDEO

---

I'm told by Trevor (M.D. at Crystal Research) that a normal domestic household video can be used to store data if it is output to the video via the serial port. You do need a black box to do the (modem like) work of modulating (or whatever they call it) the signals to get it onto video and Trevor airily informs me that such a box could be knocked up for under a hundred quid. If anybody would like to pursue this idea I for one would definitely be interested in buying a working prototype in order to back up my hard disk.... and I can envisage a great demand from other users so... come on budding entrepreneurs, I've given you ALL the same tip, who is going to do something with the idea?

#### The BRAIN Magazine

---

The Brain is published by Syntaxsoft at £18 per annum. It hasn't been distributed since long before Christmas and the Publishers are now offering a 'bumper package' when they do finally get their act together. Meanwhile it seems almost impossible to contact them by telephone, either on their hot-line help-line or to place enquiries / orders about products. One member complains that the firm are hanging on to a printer manual he sent them and he is therefore stuck for getting a cable for his Sharp printer -- everybody gets behind from time to time (who am I to call the kettle black) but a big firm like Syntaxsoft shouldn't be keeping Users hanging around for so long.

#### DISCS at low prices.

---

Unbranded discs have been going around at a couple of quid each. They are said to be new although they come ready formatted (but not in Einstein format) and you need to ensure that you do transfer the Einey format onto them because otherwise you are in for problems. They are said to originate in Germany and although OK in Teac (Tatung) drives they do not seem to run well in other drives, notably the Hitachi.

Meanwhile George Longden (3033) is able to supply new discs, branded and all legit at prices of £3.70 per single disc or £32 for ten. Although branded these discs are of various types apparently. Meanwhile down in the big sin city David Cummins (3088) says they charge up to £6 for a single disc but that the Argos chain are selling them at less than £30 for ten. The cheapest (good) discs I have heard about came from a Glasgow open-air market where some trader was flogging off old programs at £1 per time. Even if the Amstrad progs are junk the disc is worth twice that amount. Keep your own markets covered lads. However, this is a very fast moving market and it is back to the old problem. Do you shop around to save the odd few quid here and there or do you go back to your regular computer dealer who (when all is said and done) has to earn himself a living in order to stay in business in order to keep Einey serviced.

Joseph Lambourne (EUDB 3267) would like to buy a second hand printer. Anybody got one to trade?

## TRANSFERRING FILES BETWEEN AMSTRAD AND EINSTEIN COMPUTERS.

The following info is from K.J.Bucklitch (EUDB number 3206) and shows the procedure for transferring files when the two computers are linked together (remember though that the 'standard issue' Amstrad doesn't have an RS232 port already supplied). These procedures are NOTHING to do with using the AMTAT emulator disc - an altogether different and easier procedure for using AMTAT is supplied with eah AMTAT disc.

### FILE\_TRANSFERS

#### 1. CABLES.

- a) Connect RS232C Serial Interface to the Amstrad. Insert 9v power supply. Switch on at main power supply, (Wall Socket)
- b) Connect RS232 cable (DIN plug) to RS232 socket on right hand side of the Einstein. (Note White stripe to white dot.) Connect D-plug of cable to interface.  
Switch on Einstein.

#### 2. LOADING SOFTWARE.

a) <u>Amstrad.</u>	
Insert CP/M disc into Amstrad.	
Load CP/M	Type... !CPM. <ENTER>
Set Baud Rate	A> SETSIO,300 <ENTER>

Both machines are now ready to transmit/receive.

#### 3. EINSTEIN TO AMSTRAD.

- i) Set up Amstrad to receive. \*Filename=aux:[e]  
The [e] echoes the file to the screen.  
Press ENTER and the Amstrad will appear to lock up.

- ii) Set up Einstein to transmit. \*Filename TO SRL:<E> <ENTER>

You will see the disc drive come into action, the file will appear on each screen and be stored in memory. You need to send an end of file marker to indicate completion of transmission and save file on disc.

- Send End of File marker. \*EOF: to SRL: <ENTER>  
This will restore local control to the Amstrad keyboard and save the file on disc under the chosen Filename.

#### AMSTRAD TO EINSTEIN

- i) Set up Einstein to receive \*SRL: to Filename<E> <ENTER>
- ii) Set up Amstrad to transmit. \*aux:=Filename<e> <ENTER>
- iii) End of File marker. \*aux:=eof: <ENTER>

Ian Deane (EUDB 3262) reports that the only program to run is the Install program and the Repair sequence but neither enable full implementation on Einey

Alec and Amtat and Pip.

---

Alec Calderhead reports that the version of PIP on his C/PM disc was corrupted and this prevented him copying files as per the manual. ACC corrected it for him upon request. On a separate point it does sound as though more discs are getting corrupted in the post, I have had indications that this is happening in

Edinburgh, Glasgow, Newcastle and the Greater Manchester area. Any Post Office workers aware of any new machines etc that could be the culprit?

AMTAT and 'unofficial' disc drives.

---

D.J.Day (EUDB 3089) reports that his AMTAT1 works fine. AMTAT2 doesn't work at all. ACC have checked it for him and the only remaining idea is to blame the OPUS second drive which he has installed although it has coped admirably with all the other stuff he's thrown into it during the past year. One of those intractable problems but just a thought. (P.S. With official Tatung second drives now available for less than £50 isn't it sensible to stick to Tatung if you're now shopping around for a second drive?)

AMTAT & Microdraft.

---

John Watts (EUDB 3168) reports that the Microdraft package apparently converts and will give a result on DIR but he cannot get it to go any further although he thinks it is him rather than the program. I wouldn't bet on that John. Last thing he told me was he was going to double-check with ACC Computers.

MONEY-MANAGER

---

Bill Powell ( EUDB ref 3245 ) has accessed Money Manager which is written in Mallard Basic, he couldn't get into the CPC Version of Money-Manager. Bill also sent a very concise method of starting up Amtat (additionally nice because of the explanations noted along the way) but sadly it won't reproduce sharp enough to print.

80 COLUMN CARDS

---

ACC computers say that the 80 column card is (advisable' when using AMTAT but it seems that it is really essential as very little C/PM Amstrad program will run under 40 columns. 80 Column cards cost about £50 and rumours persist that some of them have buggs on board - if yours doesn't work properly it needs to be taken back to the dealers, an 80 column card either works or it doesn't and I don't know of any way in which it could be installed wrongly or the blame passed to the user.

### SOFTWARE AVAILABLE TO MEMBERS

Our software collection is arranged into volumes, sometimes a volume is devoted entirely to a special subject and some volumes are a general collection of files. Future volumes are likely to be a general mixture of all sorts because it is extremely time consuming to create volumes on which the files relate closely to each other. Each VOLUME takes up one side of a disc, sometimes the disk is almost full, it is not possible (because of the time involved) to put two volumes onto one side of a disc even in those cases where there would be sufficient space.

You can usually buy blank discs from EUDB at reasonable prices. You may, of course send your own disc (most folk do most of the time) BUT please, please, please do make sure that it is taken out of the cellophane wrapper and formatted before you send it to me.

There is a copying charge of E2 per volume to cover the cost of postage and packing. There is no need to send a stamp to get your disc back. It is an enormous help if you can send an adhesive address label. If you use a 'jiffy bag' then the same bag will be used to return your disc.... don't cellotape your bag so securely that I cannot break into it. If you send discs in an ordinary envelope then they will be returned in an ordinary envelope. Discs are usually returned the same day, allow extra delays if you send your disc by recorded or registered delivery (this is not essential and all discs will be sent back to you by ordinary post). Remember the service runs on voluntary goodwill and although I try to copy discs immediately I do have to earn a living, I do go away on holiday and am occasionally ill etc.

The software is sent out 'as is', that means that it should run but there are no guarantees of any sort given. There are programs in the collection which do the same work (sometimes better) as software which sells for twenty or thirty pounds - take the rough with the smooth is my motto. There is a lot of stuff on any one disc and I know from experience that many members have derived hours of fun and interest from any one disc. None of the programs are 'rubbish' although a few are the sort of silly little demo progs which beginners write. ALL programs have some value to somebody somewhere -- you can learn a lot by examining the listings. Many of the programs 'do something' and may spark off more ideas for you to follow up.

We do not (knowingly) distribute copyrighted software. If you think a piece of software is not legitimate please let us know and we will withdraw it if necessary.

If you need special equipment to run the volume we try to tell you in advance -- the main points to remember are that we cater for the ORIGINAL Einstein and most of the software will run on a single drive Einy. Two drives often make life easier, and if two drives are ESSENTIAL I try to remember to tell you. Everybody has 40 columns which is the standard but a lot of 80 column stuff will go onto 40 columns but can be difficult to read. (All my 'Discinfo' explanations on disc are readable in 40 columns even though I use 80 as standard). For SOME programs 80 columns is essential, but not many of this collection come into that category. If I say it needs C/PM I mean real C/PM and not Xtal DOS, and if it seems helpful to mention that something does run OK under DOS then I mention it. It doesn't matter at all whether you have a colour monitor or a TV etc.

We do welcome fresh contributions and material and ideas -- don't keep your discoveries to yourself - share them with other Einstein Owners, it is the only way that interest can be maintained in the machine. Please note that an explanatory leaflet is sent out with every volume explaining how to get it running and if you do have difficulties in accessing a disc I am always happy to talk on the phone briefly. - Have fun.
